Unification would aid industry

EFIA executive suggests way forward

A suggestion that the industry could be moving towards a unified representative organisation has come from the EFIA.

In an exclusive interview with Perimeter Systems Alison Payne, general secretary of the EFIA - European Fencing Industry Association, makes it clear that the organisation sees merit in there being 'a single unified voice for the industry.'

She says that it could act as a powerful vehicle for engaging with external bodies.

'Economically and logistically it is a no-brainer,' she said. In April, the newly elected chairman

Association, Adam Binns suggested
that there should be closer links
between industry representative bodies.


Two separate open days were
